

The right to health

“Healthy people make a healthy society and country.”

The Slovenian healthcare system is a conservative-health care model paid for through a mandatory insurance program called the Health Insurance Institute of Slovenia, HIIS (Zavod za zdravstveno zavarovanje Slovenije) that is paid by employers and employees. However, not all medical costs are covered from this insurance, with the exception of children's healthcare which is fully covered. Almost all Slovenes thus pay voluntary insurance fees for additional coverage that also help support the system. Due to the amount of funds that is put into the system, Slovenian healthcare is comparable to many other advanced European nations'. The National Health Insurance Institute oversees all healthcare services.
